WORKSHOP PROPOSAL FORM INSTRUCTIONS *APPLICATION DUE FRIDAY April 9, 2011*

Those wishing to present a workshop for the 8th Annual Gay-Straight Alliance Conference should read these instructions before filling out a workshop proposal application.

Mission:

The mission of the Annual Gay-Straight Alliance Conference is to celebrate the diversity and culture of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and allied (LGBTA) communities; collaborate across the spectrum of our identities and experiences; provide a safe forum to discuss challenges, issues and ideas facing LGBTA students today; and empower students to build not only successful student organizations, but healthy and productive lives.

Conference Registration and Fees:

Workshop presenters are required to register for the conference. It is highly recommended that all workshop applicants register for the conference as soon as possible. **The 8th Annual GSA Conference is free for all participants.**

Accommodations and Travel Expenses:

Workshop presenters are responsible for their own accommodation and travel expenses.

Deadlines:

The final deadline for all applications is April 2nd. Workshop applicants must be registered for the conference by this date in order for their proposals to be considered.

If the number of conference proposals exceeds conference capacity, selection will be based in part on the criterion of diversity related to the topic area of focus listed further below.

Notifications:

Those who turn in their applications by April 2nd will be notified of their application status by April 9th.

Length:

Submitted proposals should be 60 minutes in total length.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that presentations include an interactive component with the audience and that handouts are readily available to all workshop participants.

How to be an Ally, what issues face the Ally community, how to bring and keep allies in your GSA, developing and maintaining a Safe Space program
- Arts, Culture, and History of the LGBTQA Community
Celebrating the arts, culture and history in regards to the LGBTQA community, review of how LGBTQA community has evolved in media and society
- Education and Outreach in Schools
How to educate your school on LGBTQA issues, ally and teacher trainings, and spreading awareness of issues facing the LGBTQA community
- Coming-Out
Issues facing those that are in the process of coming out, creating supportive environments to those in coming out process
- Bodies and Gender Freedom
Issues facing those that do not fit into the gender or sexual binary norms, including those who are Transgender, Intersex and Genderqueer
- Curricula and Studies
How to incorporate the LGBTQA community into curricula, dealing with and overcoming opposition to inclusive teachings
- Faculty and Staff Concerns
Issues facing faculty and staff, in particular, advisors of GSAs
- Health/HIV Prevention
Health issues facing the LGBTQA community, STD prevention, safer sex initiatives, physical, mental and psychological health
- People of Color
Issues surrounding communities of color
- Spirituality and Faith
Being spiritual and a part of the LGBTQA community, debunking myths and incorrect teachings regarding faith and sexual orientation and gender identity, supportive faiths and reconciling organizations
